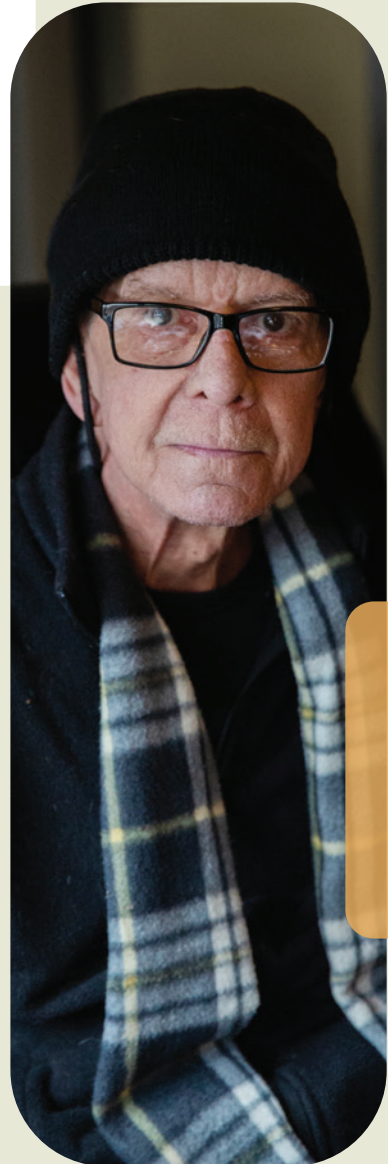

A Message from our President & Board Chair

Dear valued members of our Lighthouse community,

As we reflect on the impact Lighthouse has made in 2023, we are extremely grateful for the enduring support that makes all of our work possible. From providing food and emergency shelter to creating more affordable housing and addressing some of the root causes of poverty, Lighthouse staff and volunteers continue to meet the growing needs of our community daily.

Since taking on the leadership and management of three Runaway and Homeless Youth programs in 2023, we have continued to provide a safe place for youth, ages 10-24, in crisis. We are honored to lead these important programs for youth in need and thankful we have been able to expand upon our services in the community.

Lighthouse is increasing its capacity to respond to poverty and inequity in Oakland County by redeveloping and building upon its current headquarters’ footprint in Pontiac to create a new Lighthouse Campus - a robust and centralized base of operations, a “one-stop shop” for anyone in need of Lighthouse services, and an anchor for community involvement. The Lighthouse Campus Redevelopment and Expansion will increase our capacity to 159 non-congregate family emergency shelter beds; consolidate Lighthouse’s emergency food service program and establish a client-choice social supermarket; create an Economic Opportunity Center focused on income, employment, and educational needs of the community; increase the availability of on-site supportive services; and redevelop the current administrative building to include an indoor and outdoor event venue and cafe accessible

to the public for social connections, special events, and a neighborhood third space.

When South Oakland Shelter and Lighthouse of Oakland County merged in 2019, it was with the intention to alleviate poverty through a focus on one of its most pervasive contributing factors - the lack of affordable housing in Michigan. We are proud to say that in 2023, we laid the groundwork for more than \$100 million in multifamily affordable housing developments planned to break ground in 2024.

It has been an absolute honor to work alongside our dedicated staff, volunteers, supporters, and community partners to provide help and hope for thousands of local families and individuals this year. Thank you for helping us light the way and continue our life-changing work for those in need.

Emergency Services

> Food Distribution

Lighthouse distributes food and other necessities through food pantries in Pontiac and Clarkston, home deliveries, and partner locations throughout the county. Lighthouse makes every effort to provide well-balanced food boxes packed with fresh produce, milk, bread, and pantry staples. In 2023, there were 13,737 home deliveries completed thanks to the help of Amazon Flex and Lighthouse volunteers.



In total, the Lighthouse Food Program distributed **154,357 boxes of emergency food** to households in need in 2023.



> Emergency Shelter

Lighthouse was thrilled to open a permanent family emergency shelter in 2021! By March 2023, all of Lighthouse's emergency shelter beds were being provided in a non-congregate shelter environment. This new shelter provides the community with 18 private units and 61 beds of emergency shelter dedicated to families. Of those who exited Lighthouse's shelter programs last year, 83% transitioned into positive housing.



In 2023, Lighthouse **served 339 individuals** (including 226 children) with **21,626 nights of emergency shelter, daily meals, and essential services** to connect them to housing.



> Runaway & Homeless Youth Programs

In February 2023, Lighthouse assumed leadership and management of three runaway and homeless youth programs previously operated by Common Ground: Sanctuary, A Step Forward, and Graduated Apartment Program (GAP).

Sanctuary is a short-term, safe shelter for youths ages 10-17 who have run away, are homeless, or are in an abusive, hostile, or intense situation at home. The youth and their families are offered counseling and case management services with the goal of restabilizing the household. **A Step Forward** is a safe and home-like transitional living shelter for homeless youth ages 16-17. Designed for youth seeking independence, this program offers counseling, job training, career development, educational assistance, financial subsidies, and medical assistance. **The Graduated Apartment Program (GAP)** provides independent living services for youth ages 18-24 years old who are experiencing homelessness. GAP offers up to 24 months of housing, case management, counseling, and educational and employment support to help clients develop a greater level of stability, interpersonal skills and housing readiness.

In 2023, these important programs provided **safe shelter and essential services to 91 youth**.

> Homelessness Prevention

Preventing evictions protects families from the traumas of experiencing homelessness and aids them in more swiftly regaining stability.

Across all eviction prevention programs, Lighthouse **assisted 164 households** in preventing their eviction and maintaining their housing.



Stability Services

> Housing Programs

Lighthouse implements a variety of housing programs that transition households from homelessness to housing. Some programs offer long-term financial assistance for those experiencing domestic violence or those who have experienced chronic homelessness, and others assist households who are experiencing homelessness for the first time and need short-term assistance to regain stability.

Lighthouse’s Permanent Supportive Housing Programs provide housing and necessary support to individuals with permanent disabilities experiencing chronic homelessness. The program offers long-term housing solutions and resources to help individuals achieve stability and reach their personal goals. In 2023, 87% of clients sustained their housing after exiting the program.

Lighthouse’s Transitional Housing Program is a two-year program designed to assist women and children experiencing homelessness and/or survivors of domestic violence. Lighthouse provides safe, stable, temporary housing and supportive services as families work to secure permanent housing and pursue employment

and educational goals. In 2023, 81% of families served found permanent housing upon exiting the program.

Lighthouse’s Rapid-Rehousing Program offers rental and utility assistance to individuals and households who are fleeing domestic violence and/or experiencing homelessness. These programs range from six months up to two-years of rental assistance depending on the household need.



Across all housing programs in 2023, Lighthouse **served 209 households** (548 individuals), which includes 89 households (255 individuals) in our Rapid Re-Housing Program and 120 households (293 individuals) in our Medium-Long Term Housing Programs.

> Follow-Up Care

Lighthouse’s supportive services offer ongoing support to help households retain their housing and increase their overall stability. Individuals and families enrolled in any Lighthouse housing program are provided with flexible in-home case management. Additionally, Lighthouse provides an optional 12 months of in-home case management for those who exit our shelter and housing programs into stable housing. Providing these additional months of assistance helps to ensure households have someone to quickly turn to should they find themselves in need. During this time, Lighthouse Case Managers and Economic Mobility Coaches work with households to establish service plans specific to the clients’ housing, employment, financial, and income needs, goals, and desires.

84% of clients that exited from Stability Service programs retained their housing and increased their self-sufficiency in 2023.

Community Development

Affordable Housing Development

Lighthouse is dedicated to going beyond emergency needs by helping provide long-term affordable housing options that equip families with the foundation needed to focus on long-term goals, achieve stability, and end intergenerational poverty. Lighthouse is currently building and developing new affordable housing units and renovating existing affordable housing units to create more opportunities to end the cycle of poverty and homelessness in our community.

Lighthouse is proud to operate Coolidge Place, an affordable housing complex in Oak Park, as well as Beacon Square and Townhouses, Whittemore Place, and scattered-site single family homes in the Unity Park neighborhood, providing a total of 127 affordable housing units in Oakland County. Additionally, Carriage Circle, a recently redeveloped affordable housing building with 234 units, was completed in 2023 and is actively leasing.

Lighthouse is in the planning stages of a multi-story development that would include 54 units of affordable housing at a new site called Auburn Place and is working on the redevelopment of 40 units of affordable housing at Beacon Square and Townhomes. In addition to all of this work, the Lighthouse team is actively working with the City of Pontiac on various affordable housing options that could help bring more housing opportunities to our community in the coming years.



Lighting the Way: A Campaign to Alleviate Poverty in Oakland County

In 2022, Lighthouse began planning for a bold vision to address systemic poverty in Oakland County, and today that vision is taking shape! In order to make this vision a reality, Lighthouse has launched **Lighting the Way: A Campaign to Alleviate Poverty in Oakland County**. This initiative will create sustainable solutions to help eliminate food insecurity, address the lack of shelter for families, create affordable housing solutions, remove barriers to home ownership and increase the availability of supportive services designed to lift families from generational poverty.

To support this transformative plan, the team at Lighthouse has begun engaging a variety of community partners, funding sources, and dedicated individuals passionate about our vision. Together, we can break the cycle of poverty and create hope for our community!

By redeveloping our headquarters in Pontiac, we will create the **Lighthouse Campus**, a centralized base of operations with four distinct and impactful elements.

➤ Housing Opportunity Center

The Housing Opportunity Center will add 98 non-congregate family emergency shelter beds in a new building, increasing total capacity to 159 shelter beds in private apartments. On-site case managers will provide supportive services designed to meet clients' immediate needs, and provide the support needed to transition into permanent housing.

Additionally, our Runaway Homeless Youth programs, will also offer services and interim housing solutions for unaccompanied youth ages 10-24.

➤ Economic Opportunity Center

Each year, more than 1,500 Lighthouse clients and community members will be able to connect to social workers and access on-site resources to help them transition from poverty to self-sufficiency.

Services include:

- Employment, income, and financial coaching
- Utility and eviction prevention assistance
- Mental and physical health services and referrals
- Help securing cell phones, clothing, and household items
- Access to a computer lab and printing

On-site partners include the Wellness Plan, providing health care to uninsured/underinsured residents, and Center for Employment Opportunities, providing transitional employment opportunities for formerly incarcerated individuals.

➤ Social Supermarket

This addition will allow families to shop (free of charge) for the food they prefer, rather than receiving a box of pre-selected items. In addition, Lighthouse will also expand our overall food distribution by serving satellite locations in Clarkston, Southfield, Royal Oak, and Ferndale.

These food programs will continue to leverage the power of our food bank and rescue partners, Gleaners and Forgotten Harvest, to procure and deliver food where it is needed most.

➤ Community Event Spaces and Cafe

Multiple areas will be developed across the campus that will allow community groups, partner organizations, and volunteers to gather, host activities, and create opportunities for engagement. A few of these spaces include:

- Dining Room – A multi-use dining area and commercial kitchen where community groups can prepare/serve meals, host events, and offer supportive activities for families.
- Community Room and Terrace - An indoor-outdoor space that can be used as an event venue for our families as well as community groups and partner agencies.
- Café - An inclusive, welcoming and delicious neighborhood-based place for the community to informally connect and gather. This café concept and associated commercial kitchen will support a range of uses, including job training, entrepreneurship, and much more.

In addition to the development of the Lighthouse Campus, this campaign intends to create a pool of capital designed to increase access to affordable housing and help more individuals and families become homeowners. Altogether, the Lighting the Way campaign represents a \$40M investment into our community.

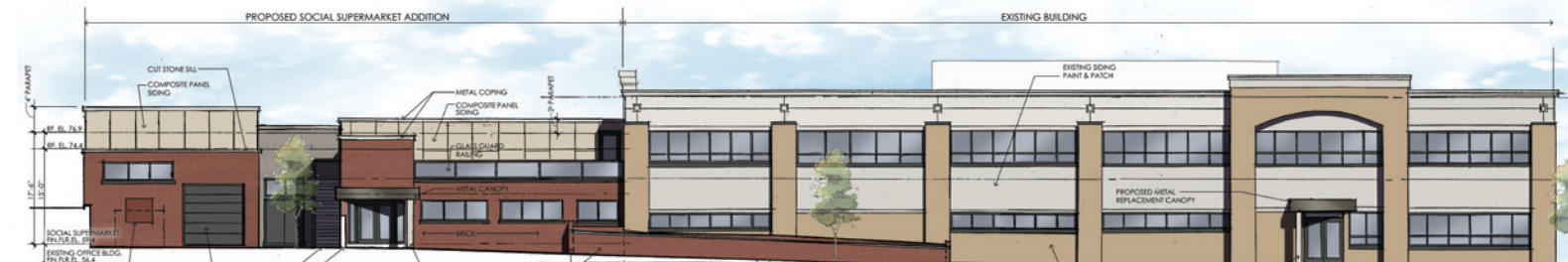

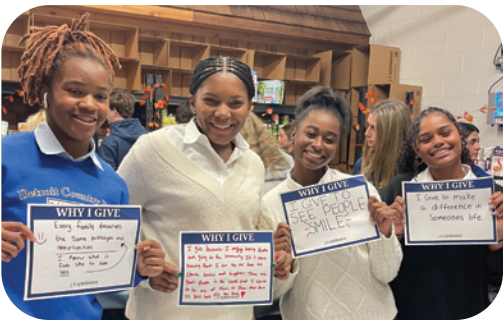

Annual Meeting

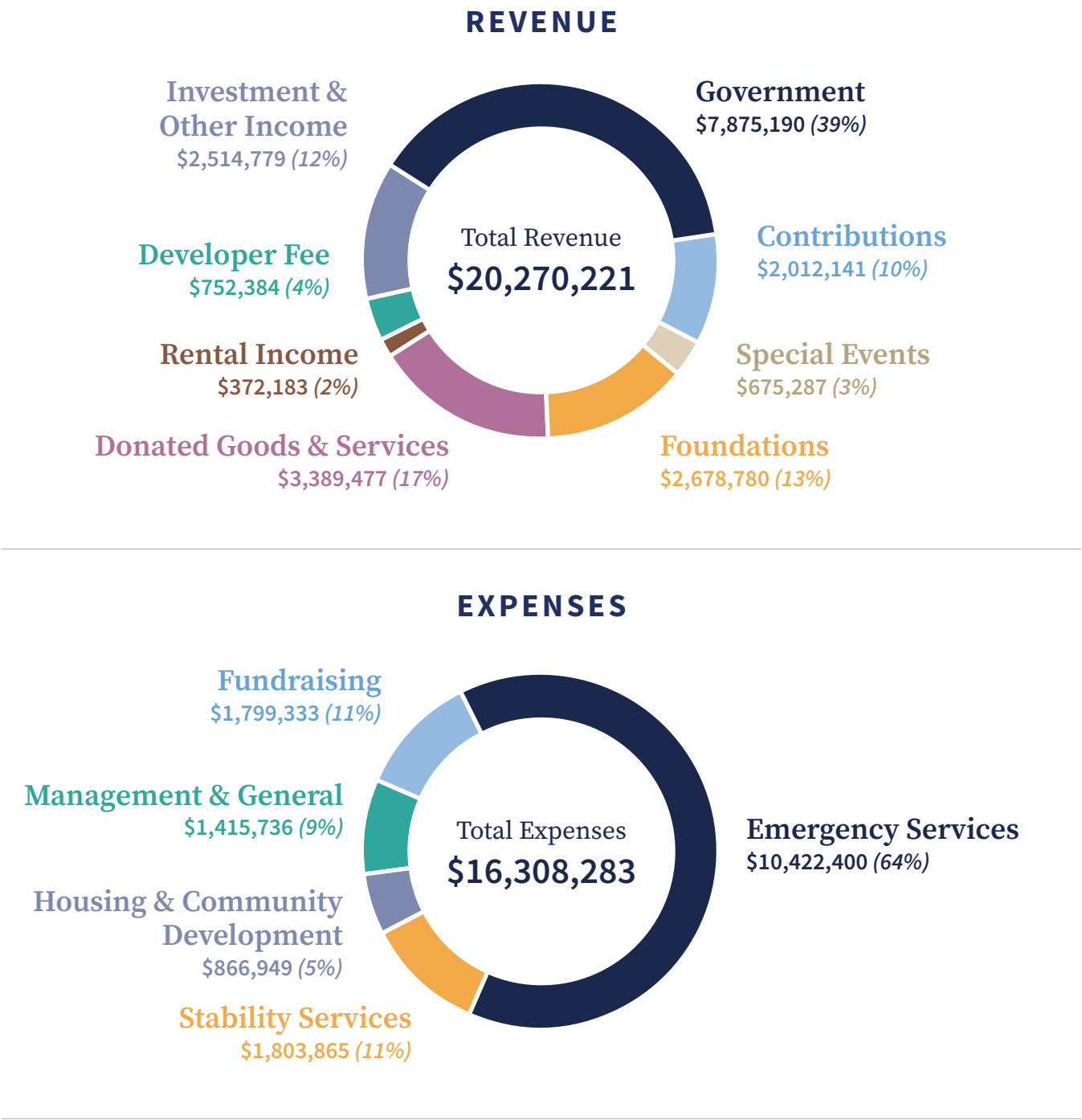

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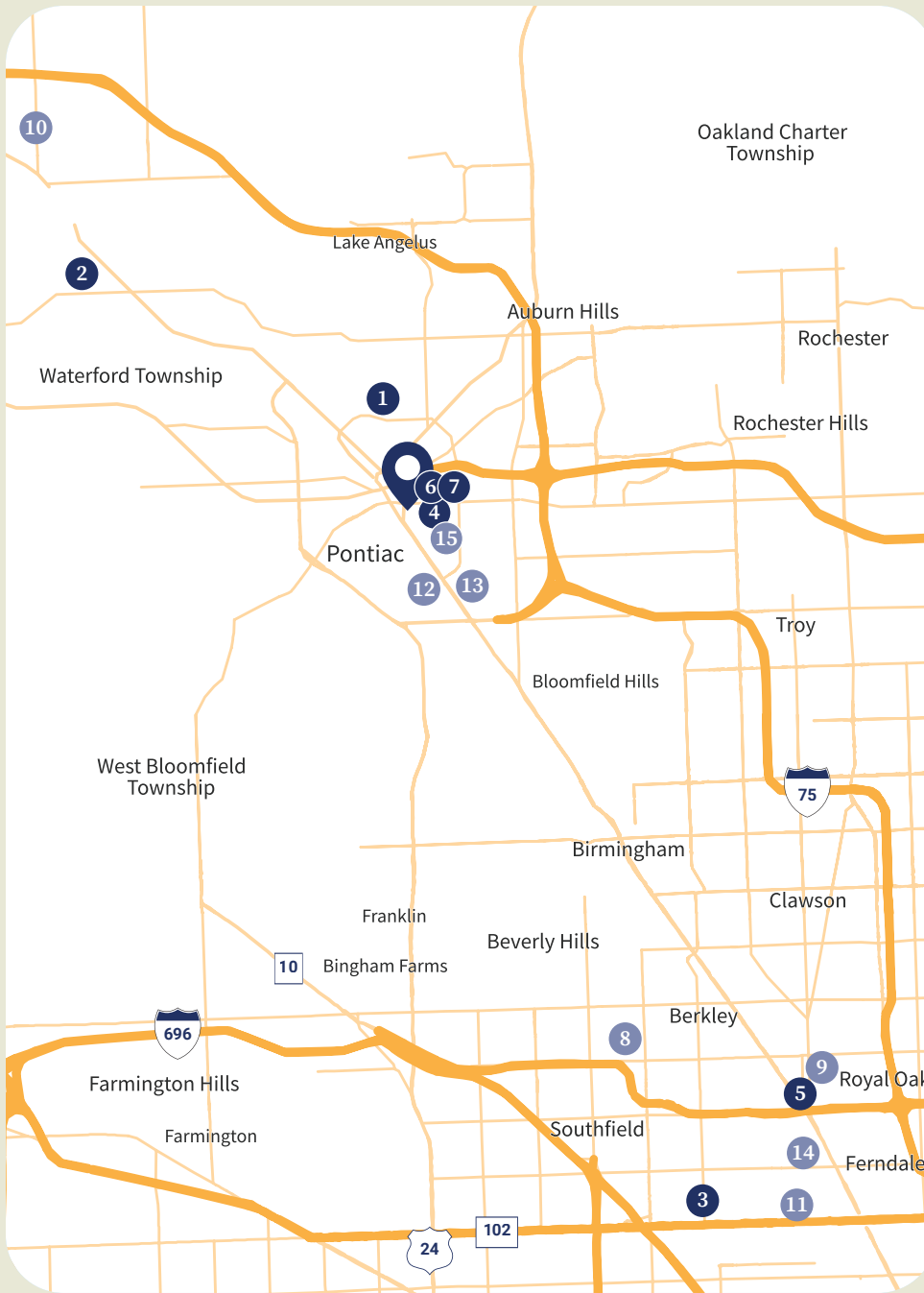
